During the morning, students study general English and French within the day's theme. They will work with their classmates to create and present projects in the afternoon.


Our workshops encourage linguistic autonomy, flexibility, and results! Students will work collaboratively with their teacher and peers on daily projects to complete and present.

FAQ & Quebec City and Montreal Fun Facts

66.5% of Montreals speak French as their mother tongue, and 92% are fluent in English and French, making Montreal the most bilingual city in Canada.

Montreal has the highest number of restaurants per capita in Canada and the second highest in North America after New York City.

The Underground City – a series of interconnected tunnels beneath Montreal runs for over 32 km (20 mi). In the winter, over 500,000 people use the tunnels daily. The tunnels connect shopping malls, museums, universities, hotels, banks, offices, and seven metro stations.

In Quebec City, you'll discover a rich history within its UNESCO World Heritage-listed Old Town, with cobblestone streets and charming European architecture. The iconic Château Frontenac, a historic luxury hotel, stands as the most photographed hotel in the world.

Is the city safe?

Students are accompanied by their leader at all times; however, they are allowed to travel independently between their homestay and the summer campuses. While the cities are generally safe and residents are friendly and helpful, students should remain vigilant of their surroundings and promptly report any suspicious activity or discomfort to either a BLI staff member or their homestay family.

Am I allowed to explore on my own?

If you would like to explore the city by yourself or have a family member you want to spend some time with, ask your leader for the authorization form. You may be allowed to leave one time for a period of a few hours.

What if I get lost?

BLI's emergency number will be available 24/7 if you need it. Call or text the emergency number so one of the leaders can come and find you.

What should I pack in my suitcase?

While summer in Canada is fantastic, it can still have cool evenings, so it's crucial to be well-prepared. We suggest bringing lightweight, comfortable clothing suitable for warm weather, such as t-shirts, shorts, swimsuits, and sunscreen. Don't forget to include a light jacket or sweater for cooler evenings and any outdoor adventures you will embark on.

Do I have to travel to school by myself?

If you are staying with a host family, they will give you instructions on how to get to and from school by public transportation. You can always travel with your roommate. Students in residence will always travel with their leaders.
